

Namaste and Welcome to India! You will be met, assisted and transferred to check into your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure until dinner at the hotel this evening.

Formerly known as Bombay, Mumbai is referred to as the New York of India. Mumbai has lots to offer, from its renowned Bollywood film industry, fashion, colonial-era architecture, gateway of India by waterfront, the home to Asia's largest slums to the world's most expensive homes. Mumbai with its colonial and Art Deco buildings, tall skyscrapers, wild traffic and frenetic pace of life, is one of India's most Intriguing cities.

Sunday 9 March 2024

Mumbai

This morning you will be met by our expert guide for a full day's sightseeing starting with a visit to the 140- year-old washermen's colony - an open-air laundromat locally known as Mahalaxmi Dhobi Ghat. Next, we visit Mani Bhawan which was the HQ of Mahatma Gandhi.

At Churchgate railway station we witness the unique lunchbox delivery system, Dabbawala. This practice started in 1890 when the British and Persians needed convenience meals delivered. Dabbawalla's collect hot, home-cooked lunches and deliver them to office workers around the city by bicycle or train. Continue to Sassoon Docks, one of the oldest docks in the city where you will see fish hung out to dry.



In the afternoon visit iconic 1871 Leopold Cafe & bar, a must visit for Shantaram fans.

Later we head for the Gateway of India, built on the harbourside to welcome King George V and Queen Mary to India. Here we enjoy a photo-stop outside the popular Taj Mahal Palace Hotel and surrounding colonial era buildings such as the Bombay High Court, Bombay University and the Prince of Wales Museum.



Next is the UNESCO World Heritage site - Victoria Terminus Train Station, built in 1888 in the finest Victorian-Gothic style. Later we visit the Dharavi slums, famed location of the move 'Slumdog Millionaire'. Gain an insight into slum life visiting their schools, mazelike alleyways and small industries. After the tour return to hotel. BD • Many of the sightseeing spots we will be covering are areas mentioned in the infamous 2003 novel – Shantaram (by Gregory David Roberts). So if you haven't already read this book, it may be worthwhile. Or now available to watch on Apple TV..

Monday 10 March 2025

Mumbai - Chennai

After breakfast transfer to Mumbai airport for your flight to Chennai. (Flight details to be confirmed)

In Chennai, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. ~ The Residency Towers for 2 nights (or similar) BD

Tuesday 11 March 2025

Chennai

After breakfast, meet our guide for a talk about the traditions of the local culture. We take a heritage walk at the British Fort St. George, built in the 17th century it is the pristine HQ of state government. Next visit the oldest surviving English church in India, St Marys Church, famed as the wedding venue for Clive of India. Capture the real life of Madras in the bustling bazaars of George Town and see the colourful 7th century Dravidian architecture of Kapaleeshwarar Temple.

Explore fine Indo-Saracenic buildings by the beachside including San Thome Basilica built by Portuguese explorers in 1520. At sunset we visit Chennai's Marina Beach to interact with locals playing cricket and selling their catch of the day. **BD**

Wednesday 12 March 2025

Chennai - Pondicherry

After breakfast and check out you will be driven to the French city of Pondicherry (150 kms, 3 hours). Enroute visit the Shore Temples of Mahabalipuram.

Thursday 13 March 2025

Pondicherry

Welcome to 'Cote d'Azur' of India! Influenced by the 1674 French East India Company, we explore this unique heritage on a walk through the colonial streets of Old Pondicherry Town with its mustard-coloured houses, chic shops and quaint boulevards. See the Muslim Quarter, Ville Noir and French Quarter.

Itinerary:

Later we visit Auroville, an experimental community founded in 1968 by the spiritual leader Mirra Alfassa as a town where people from all over the world could live in harmony. The philosophy of Auroville is based on the teachings of Sri Aurobindo, a poet, philosopher, visionary and guru, who died in 1950. **BD**

Friday 14 March 2025

Pondicherry - Chennai - Kochi

Today after breakfast and check out you will be transferred to Chennai airport for the flight to Kochi.

5.45 pm Depart CHENNAI on Indigo Airlines Flight 6E 597 7.00 pm Arrive KOCHI

Upon arrival you will be met and transferred to your hotel.

Saturday 15 March 2025

Kochi

After breakfast you will be met by our expert local guide for your heritage tour. We will walk in the Old City (Fort Kochi) which has drawn explorers to its shores for over 600 years. Discover traditional houses at vibrant Princes Street, known for the British, Portuguese and Dutch architecture of its local residences, street bazaars and cafés.

We reach Old Kochi Beach to see local fisherman demonstrate the use of 14th century giant Chinese fishing nets introduced by traders of the Mongol Empire.

We continue on to India's oldest European church built by Portuguese Friars. The St Francis Church dates back to the 1500's and is where the tomb of Vasco da Gama rests.



Next we drive or hop-on a local Tuk-Tuk to Mattancherry. The 16th century Portuguese Dutch Palace here features preserved murals from Hindu and South Indian epics. Explore the Jewish town of Kochi where a 400-year-old Pardesi Jewish Synagogue resides.

Explore the street markets which includes a spice tour. The area has been a trader's hub since the 14th century, its markets renowned for trading between the Europeans and Arabs. Today it is home to traditional spices, oils, arts and crafts. Returning to your hotel, we will this evening go to a vintage wood-lined theatre for a traditional Kathakali Dance show, telling ancient stores with intricate hand-eye coordination. Before the show begins, we go backstage to see the dancers' make-up routine and ceremony. **BD**

Sunday 16 March 2025

Kochi - Munnar

After breakfast and check out you will be picked up from your hotel and driven to Munnar (135 kms). On arrival check in and spend the rest of the day at leisure. Munnar Hill Station sits in the Western Ghats range of mountains at 5,000 feet above sea level. This is South India's largest tea-growing region, carpeted in emerald green tea plantation hills.

Munnar

Located high in the Cardamom Hills, Munnar was developed to cultivate spices and varieties of tea plants during the British Raj Era. The entire area is covered with thick forests and neatly groomed tea estates with planter's bungalows and grand old churches.

This morning we visit some of the family-owned tea plantations in the region. Learn about growing tea and see how the leaves are classified, processed, and packaged. We also visit the iconic Tata Tea Factory and Museum to taste the various spices, herbs to teas that are grown in the area. Some of the main spices cultivated here are ginger, garlic, cardamom, vanilla, pepper, cinnamon, coffee, tea, clove and nutmeg - the fragrance is in the air!

Next, we take a walk in the Eravikulam National Park of Kerala.

Amongst other rare flora and fauna found here, encounter the Nilgiri Tahrs a species of mountain goat exclusive to the region. Exotic birds

Spend the rest of the day relaxing, enjoying the sunset with some High-Tea at your hotel. **BD**

Tuesday 18 March 2025

Munnar - Alleppey

After breakfast and check out, we journey to Alleppey Jetty Point (160 kms) to board a traditional Kerala backwater houseboat. These converted rice barges called 'Kettuvallam' are over 100 feet long and built of coconut fibres. Enjoy traditional South Indian meals created by your onboard chef.

Wednesday 19 March 2025

Alleppey

Relax and enjoy your journey at a leisurely pace as we cruise through scenic lakes, lagoons and floating villages, witnessing every-day rural life. BLD

After breakfast you will be picked up from Alleppey Jetty for the drive to Kochi (90 kms, 2 hours) and check in at your hotel. Enjoy a traditional Kathakali Dance show of Kerala in the evening, followed by a farewell dinner.
